WELCOME

Frances Marshall's stunning photograph of mezzo Sharon Carty with her 'suitcase arias' is the platform from which we embark on a journey of discovery in Galway this season.

The mass movement of people towards and around Europe is one of the great crises facing our society today. Alongside that, migration is one of the over-arching themes of the Galway 2020 programme which is now just around the corner. Furthermore, down through the centuries, musicians have often been willing (and not so willing) travellers, embarking on long arduous concert tours to show off their talents or living in exile to avoid persecution. And so it seems fitting that we explore this theme of travel, of exchange of ideas and of cross-fertilisation through music, tapping into our Wanderlust theme in various different ways throughout the season.

The RTÉ Concert Orchestra will present a programme of music from travel / adventure movies while Sharon Carty will dazzle with her baroque suitcase arias. String quartets from far and wide will pack their suitcases and head to Galway – the Goldner Quartet from Australia will make their Irish debut and the Quartetto di Venezia will make a welcome return to MfG. We present the radio.string.quartet in association with the Galway Jazz Festival and the ConTempo Quartet will once again shine at our Midwinter Festival, Swansong. This will be the third and final act of our trilogy of festivals marking different stages of composers' lives. Extra concerts have been added and a veritable feast awaits. We also present, as usual, the Messiah with the IBO, the RTÉ National Symphony Orchestra and our Emily Anderson Concert. We collaborate again with Cúirt to bring you a fascinating evening about the disappearance of a Stradivarius violin. And we offer a diverse series of lunchtime concerts in association with *Arts in Action* and the new BA degree in music at NUIG.

We are very pleased to strengthen our relationship with NUI Galway as a new BA in Music programme comes on stream. Not only have we moved our offices onto the campus, but we are signing an agreement that formalises our relationship for the coming three years. In parallel, we continue to liaise with staff and students at GMIT, and as Galway 2020 approaches, we are exploring opportunities for them to put their developing skills to the service of our artistic programme.





Born in 1990 in New Zealand, **Benjamin Baker** studied at the Yehudi Menuhin School and the Royal College of Music where he was awarded the Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother Rose Bowl. He won the Emily Anderson Prize at the Royal Philharmonic Society in 2013 and went on to win 1st Prize at the 2016 Young Concert Artists auditions in New York and 3rd Prize at the Michael Hill Competition in New Zealand, establishing a strong international presence.

Born in Hungary, **Daniel Lebhardt** won 1st Prize at the Young Concert Artists auditions in Paris and New York in 2014 aged 22. A year later he was selected by Young Classical Artists Trust in London and in 2016 won the Most Promising Pianist prize at the Sydney International Competition.

We continue presenting young promising artists this year with pianist **Joe O'Grady** (13) who opens the concert with Beethoven's *Pathétique Sonata*.
