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
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Welcome from our Artistic Director

MUSIC FOR GALWAY 33rd International Concert Season

As incoming Artistic Director of Music for Galway, it gives me pleasure to present my first season which I think includes a great variety of musical delights to intrigue and attract devoted music-lovers and newcomers alike. We have honoured my predecessor Jane O'Leary by commissioning her to write a solo piano piece which will be premiered by Korean pianist Ah Ruem Ahn on November 14th. We will also have the Irish première, on October 30th, of Ian Wilson's "The Little Spanish Prison" performed by David Cohen and Sasha Grynyuk. Other highlights in a packed season include the ever-popular Messiah in a period performance by the IBO and Resurgam, Donizetti's hugely entertaining L'Elisir d'Amore (one of the most-

performed operas of all time) performed by Opera Theatre Company and a recital of fabulous classics by Ireland's legendary pianist John O'Conor. The Mid-Winter Festival in January will focus on the period from 1894 to 1913 when the composition of music took off in all kinds of dramatic directions, rule-books were thrown up and new musical languages and sound-worlds assailed our concert halls and salons. Thanks to all our sponsors and supporters who make the season possible.




