HEINRICH SCHÜTZ Mattäus-Passion SWV 479

Heinrich Schütz' Mattäus-Passion is one of the composer's three passions written towards the end of his life. These passions, and in particular the Mattäus-Passion, represent the crowning achievement of the greatest German composer of the seventeenth century, and paved the way for the later settings of J.S. Bach and others. The Mattäus-Passion is written for choir and ten soloists, including the major roles of Evangelist and Jesus. The whole work is unaccompanied, its spare texture nevertheless containing passages of rich harmonies and dramatic depictions of the Gospel narrative. This is a passion setting which is the perfect distilled reflection of Good Friday's stark atmosphere and scripture's compelling record.



LATECOMERS

Please check starting times for individual concerts on our website. Latecomers will only be admitted during a break in the programme.

TICKETS

Concessions are 10% off standard priced tickets and apply to senior citizens (over 66).

Solidarity tickets are 50% off standard priced tickets and are available to full time students, asylum seekers, people in receipt of job seeker allowance and disability allowance. Solidarity tickets can be purchased online and collected at the door with proof of relevant status. Solidarity refers to ticket price only and does not denote a relaxed performance.

Please note that all tickets are non-refundable.

RELAXED PERFORMANCES

Our lunchtime performances, in partnership with Arts in Action at the University of Galway and MfG Out and About concerts are designated as relaxed performances. This means that in this context we strive to create a welcoming space for everyone, to provide a chance for us all to enjoy the best of music with the understanding that some of us may benefit from a more relaxed setting. To make these concerts more accessible, rather than producing written programme notes, the artists will introduce the pieces they have chosen. This also means that we all (including the artists) will be accepting and welcoming, should there be more movement or sound in the room. In this context we embrace the fact that enjoyment comes in all shapes and sizes!
