It was the coming Beethoven bicentenary year that inspired this title and we will start celebrating it this autumn with the Emily Anderson Concert, where our friends the ConTempo Quartet will give a foretaste of the Midwinter Festival to come in January. This will be dedicated fully to Beethoven's cycle of string quartets, the late ones truly ground-breaking.

We also focus on the merit of two greats of the Eastern European tradition: Kafka and Kurtág, the latter breaking the boundaries of time as he enters into a musical dialogue with fragments of Kafka's writing.

Breaking boundaries can be an opportunity for opening up, connecting, letting in. PROPHECY AND PASSION

Our Good Friday concert this year views the events of Christ's Passion through two lenses: Old Testament prophecy and New Testament narrative. The two central works which give the concert its title are both by German composer, theorist, writer and poet Christoph Demantius (1567–1643): Weissagung des Leiden und Sterben Jesu Christi, and Johannespassion. This Passion setting is the last and finest example of the "motet" passion, and combines ancient style with innovative and colourful treatment of the text. Interspersed in between will be vocal works for solo voices by Hammerschmidt, Schein, Schütz and Scheidt. Collegium will be joined for this performance by six singers from Resurgam, harp (Siobhán Armstrong) and chamber organ (Malcolm Proud).

Engagement with students of the BA in Music

As part of our strategic partnership with the University of Galway, some of our visiting artists are engaging with the students of the BA in Music. This season it will be opera singers **Sharon Carty** and **Eamonn Mulhall** who will discuss their education, career path and performance in opera. Violinist **Karen Dervan** gives a career talk on her life holding a foot in both camps of arts administration and performance. **Levi Andreassen**, double bass player, will share his experience making his life as a soloist, chamber music player pushing the limits of his instrument.

Solidarity tickets can be purchased online and collected at the door with proof of relevant status. **Solidarity refers to ticket price only and does not denote a relaxed performance.**

Please note that all tickets are non-refundable.

Relaxed Performances

Our lunchtime concerts (in association with Arts in Action at the University of Galway) and our MfG Out and About concerts are designated as relaxed performances. This means that in this context we strive to create a welcoming space for everyone, to provide a chance for us all to enjoy the best of music with the understanding that some of us may benefit from a more relaxed setting. To make these concerts more accessible, rather than producing written programme notes, the artists will introduce the pieces they have chosen. This also means that we all (including the artists) will be accepting and welcoming, should there be more movement or sound in the room. In this context we embrace the fact that enjoyment comes in all shapes and sizes!
